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

Claude Perras, Alamin Mussa and Zhe Lu from the Business Analytics Services Directorate have spent countless efforts to support the Procurement Branch to combat the pandemic through collecting contracting data and producing statistical reports essential in maintaining an up-to-date and detailed picture of Covid procurement by PSPC. These were above and beyond BASD's regular reporting function, including new data points, and high expectation for timely and quality reporting. For instance, the team has worked hard to produce the quarterly 'Transparency Tables' which give Canadians a detailed picture of the Government of Canada's procurement efforts in fighting the pandemic.



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Through its well-orchestrated collaboration, the negotiation and legal services team collectively contributed to the signing of agreements with AstraZeneca, Sanofi and GlaxoSmithKline, Johnson & Johnson, Novavax, Pfizer, and Moderna, establishing a guaranteed supply of potential vaccines to help keep Canadians safe and healthy. The team also supported Canada's participation in the COVID-19 Vaccine Global Access (COVAX) Facility, a global procurement mechanism that helped deliver fair, equitable, and timely access to COVID-19 vaccines. They are a shining example of a results oriented strategic partnership that worked exceptionally well. Governments across the globe were racing to get contracts in place for their countries, notwithstanding the fact that none of the vendors had regulatory approval in any jurisdiction to this point, and it is in this context that the joint team developed and advised on novel approaches to standard acquisition clauses and conditions, and advocated as best they could to protect Canada's interests in a market that heavily favoured vendors. The team has had to sacrifice their personal time and time with families to provide their high quality legal and specialized policy advice under considerable pressure and time constraints all for the benefit of Canadians.

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As the contracting arm of Government, the COVID-19 Team was relied upon to efficiently resolve issues with department ad agency clients and suppliers. As such, they ensured they understood their clients' needs and maintained open lines of communications to keep their clients informed, and ensured all information was shared in a timely matter and understood by decision-makers. The contracting officers also used their rich corporate knowledge to share information and lessons learned through their files with team members who may benefit from the information. They openly contributed to resolving issues or challenges that come up on files under the responsibility of other team members. Many of the contracting officers surpassed what is usually expected of them in their normal jobs, and senior management witnessed their initiative, judgment and dependability, which proved instrumental in supporting high stake decisions that needed to be made. In spite of stressful circumstances and unpredictable demand, the COVID-19 Team successfully established and maintained productive and positive working relationships with various stakeholders in their personal and organizational practices. The team also had to develop new ways of delivering their services remotely and without access to their usual work environments and tools, and establish unprecedented mechanisms to collect, analyse and track information about purchases and deliveries and continually improved tracking documents for PPEs, medical supplies and testing.

The employees of the Procurement Operations Support Division deserve to be recognized for the exceptional work that they have been doing since the start of the pandemic and the work that they continue to do every day since. As a result of COVID-19, they had to adapt, think things through and come up with innovative ways and solutions and continue their bid and requisition handling process to ensure the continuity of their essential services by turning it almost 100% virtual. This included the implementation of a new and more efficient system to enable PSPC to receive a greater volume of bid submissions via electronic faxes simultaneously, they coordinated virtual public openings of bids rather than physical, a new method for the delivery of paper-based bids to the Procurement Contracting Agents, the creation of a virtual Covid operational tight are to centralize operational functions to support procurement and fast track resolutions of issues to better support emergency covid procurement.

These employees have been there since day one, risking exposure to COVID-19, working day and night, up to 16 hours / day, 7 days a week during the height of the first waves to process Goods and Services Request forms and processing thousands of mask samples and bids.

Their hard work and dedication allowed Procurement Contracting Agents to rapidly award contracts to procure all sorts of goods and services that were required for the establishment of portable hospitals, flights to bring Canadian citizens back to safety and the purchase Personal Protective Equipment to protect the front line workers who are out there saving lives.

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In August 2020, the National Research Council of Canada (NRC) was mandated by the Government of Canada to establish a new Biologics Manufacturing Centre (BMC). A team composed of procurement professionals from NRC and National Defence (DND) was quickly pulled together to provide the knowledge and expertise required to move this project forward. The unprecedented high global demand for critical equipment and materials, foreign protectionism measures, shortages of materials, consumables, unavailability of stock and long lead times created unprecedented challenges that had to be quickly addressed by the procurement team which had less than 10 months to complete the sourcing, delivery and installation of over 250 pieces of specialized equipment in addition to raw materials and consumables. The NRC and DND BMC procurement team demonstrated strength and adaptability during a very challenging year and under exceptional circumstances.
