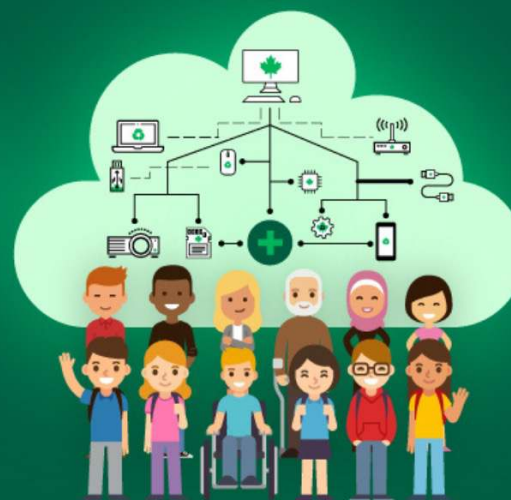

Message from the Premier Partner

Innovation, Science and Economic Development's (ISED) is pleased to be a Premier Partner at this year's Canadian Institute for Procurement and Materiel Management Regional Workshop in Vancouver.

ISED delivers the Computers for Schools Plus (CFS+) program, which helps extend the useful life of electronic equipment, and reduces the environmental impact of electronic waste, and offers practical work internships to young Canadians to help them develop advanced digital skills for the job market.

Originally, the program provided computers solely to schools. Over its 29 years of success, it expanded its mandate to deliver computers beyond schools to libraries, not-for-profit organizations, Indigenous communities and low-income families. The CFS+ program is now expanding its refurbished device offerings to include not only desktop computers but also laptops, tablets and smartphones.

Message from the Premier Partner

Since 1993, the program has provided nearly 1.8 million computers, given more than 8,000 young Canadians market-relevant skills and experience in information and communications technology fields and has diverted over 11,000 tons of e-waste from landfills. The program also delivered 7,500 computers to Syrian Refugees and delivered close to 50,000 computers to low-income families.

Partnerships are fundamental to the success of the CFS+ program. We recognize the key role that individuals, schools, communities, governments, not-for-profits organizations and private sector partners play in encouraging donations, refurbishing equipment and distributing hardware and accessories to the next generation seeking to learn and work in the new digital economy.

We are looking forward to building relationships with CIPMM regional community, sharing best practices, and learning how surplus and end-of-life electronic equipment are managed within your respective organizations.

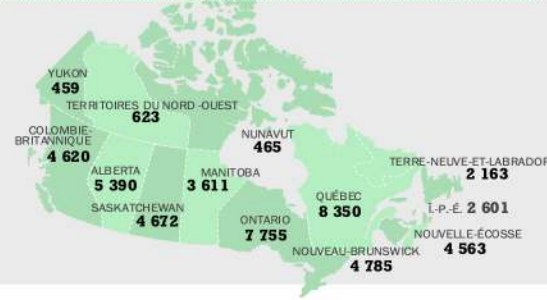
