
What is Open Data?

- Open Data is defined as structured data that is machine-readable, freely shared, used and reused without restrictions.
 - Data sets released by the Government of Canada should be as accessible as possible, with accessibility defined as the ease with which information can be obtained (standard, nonproprietary).
 - Data sets released by the Government of Canada should be made available in widely-used file formats that easily lend themselves to machine processing (e.g. CSV, XML).
 - The Government of Canada releases datasets under the <u>Open Government Licence – Canada</u> agreement.
- To date, Canada has released over 200,000 datasets, including core datasets that support good governance and transparency.

GC-wide Open Data Strategy - Evolution



Promoting transparency, empowering citizens, fighting corruption and harnessing new technologies to strengthen governance.

- *Apr 2012*: Canada joins the <u>Open Government Partnership</u>, announcing its commitment to an open government initiative along three main streams: open information, open data, and open dialogue.
- Oct 2012: <u>Canada's First Action Plan on Open Government (2012 2013)</u> is released.
- Feb. 2013: TBS starts an annual national event, the Canadian Open Data Experience (CODE), to promote access to the government's free data.
- June 2013: Canada adopts the <u>G8 Open Data Charter</u> and its Canadian implementation resulted in the <u>G8 Open Data Charter – Canada's action plan</u>.
- Oct. 2014: Canada's Second Action Plan on Open Government (2014 2016) is released, and it includes commitments to public procurement and Open Contracting.
 - PWGSC to pilot the Open Contracting on Buyandsell.gc.ca. The pilot will disclose PWGSC contracts and procurement data to the public via a simple and standard format.
- Nov 2015: The Liberal Party of Canada Platform promises "to amend the Access to Information Act so that all government data and information is made open by default in machine-readable, digital formats."





Open Data on Buyandsell.gc.ca

- As early as 2012, Buyandsell.gc.ca was the first GC web service to make previously inaccessible
 procurement information available as open data, free of charge and available for republishing
- Today, Buyandsell.gc.ca is the authoritative source for the following open datasets:

- In the roadmap: to release more open datasets, to capture stakeholders' feedback and interest in new open datasets





Open Contracting Pilot, on Buyandsell.gc.ca

- **Commitment**: To pilot the usage of the Open Contracting Data Standard, on Buyandsell.gc.ca, by linking the phases of the procurement process using data from procurements conducted by PWGSC.
- The Open Contracting Data Standard is an open standard for sharing structured information on all stages of the contracting process.



- **Game changer!** Most information across every stage of the public contracting pipeline to be made publicly available. Canada to lead this work internationally.
- **GC-wide Final Vision:** Upon the completion of the Pilot, TBS intends to make "Open Contracting" the de-facto contracting standard in the federal government following Buyandsell.gc.ca results.





Open Contracting Pilot, on Buyandsell.gc.ca (cont.)

- What has been accomplished:
 - 2014: Buyandsell.gc.ca worked with the World Wide Web (WWW) foundation and the World Bank to define the Open Contracting Data Standard (OCDS)
 - 2015: Buyandsell.gc.ca provided an initial showcase of the new OCDS using PWGSC procurement data:

 - May 2015: Third International Open Data Conference: Buyandsell.gc.ca invited to present the initial release of the Open Contracting Pilot.
 - 2015: Canada is the first government in the world to provide high-quality open procurement data that complies with the Open Contracting Data Standard.
- In the roadmap:
 - To complete on the data requirements, by incorporating Spend and Requisition data into the OCDS format.





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
