### GC Transfer - Innovation in Materiel Management and Disposal

For assets that have not reached their end-of-life we encourage offering these assets to other federal government departments by advertising on GCTransfer. This session will provide an overview of GCTransfer and how assets with remaining useful life can be transferred within the Federal Government ensuring assets are fully utilized before they reach the end of life. An overview of GCTransfer services will be highlighted including showcasing the benefits and diversity of assets available for transfer within the government using this service.

# **CORCAN - Managing your Social Procurement Opportunities**

By acquiring from CORCAN, purchases contribute to a reinvestment in the offender employment and employability program and also lessen your procurement and administrative tasks.
